MAKING WORK EXPERIENCE FOR ALL **WORK**:

Work experience is a huge topic in the careers education world right now, with the Government's commitment to work experience for every secondary school student and the Department for Education's recent careers guidance update, particularly Benchmark 6. From September 2025, they expect all secondary leavers to have completed two weeks worth of work experience activities; including real work experience tasks, interactions with employers and employees, work experience placements, feedback, and reflection. Yet research shows that fewer than half of young people in the UK currently complete any work experience at all before leaving school. At Elevate EBP, we have long championed the value of high-quality placements, and for over 27 years we've worked with schools, colleges, and a variety of local employers to deliver safe and meaningful work experience that **works**. Many of our placements are within sectors such as retail and hospitality, where students not only develop their transferable skills but sometimes also secure part-time or seasonal roles, making their work experience a genuine launchpad for a future career.

EDUCATION:

REDUCING NEET NUMBERS WITH TARGETED SUPPORT:

The number of young people not in education, employment or training (NEET) is rising at an alarming rate, with nearly one million in the UK now NEET. The reasons are complex and can include mental health challenges, SEND needs, socio-economic circumstances, social pressures or a lack of clear and relatable guidance. At Elevate EBP, we know tackling this issue means more than simply signposting; it's about breaking down barriers, building confidence and providing personalised support. Through initiatives such as the **Next Steps Programme** with Liverpool City Region Careers Hub / The Careers & Enterprise Company, the **Your Future Programme** with Knowsley Council, and the **Connect & Thrive Programme** funded by The National Lottery Community Fund, we have been working intensively with young people across the Liverpool City Region to identify clear pathways, guide them through application processes and interviews, boost confidence and self-esteem, and support mental health and wellbeing, helping them to take positive steps and reducing the risk of long-term disengagement.

Our commitment to careers support extends beyond primary and secondary education. We regularly work with further and higher education institutions to ensure their students have access to meaningful opportunities such as work experience, practice interviews and employer encounters.




